Celebrating America's Warriors

From April 30 — May 2, President George W. Bush and Mrs. Laura Bush hosted the Bush Institute's fifth annual Warrior 100K (W100K) — a 100 kilometer bike ride for the United States military personnel wounded in Iraq and Afghanistan.

This year's ride took place at President and Mrs. Bush's Prairie Chapel Ranch in Crawford Texas. Seventeen Warriors were chosen to participate, representing the Army, Marine Corps, and National Guard.

PRIDE IN AMERICA'S HEROS

Before the ride began, President Bush recognized the service and sacrifice of the warriors, stating: " I'm proud to be their friend, I was proud to be their Commander in chief, and now I'm proud to be riding mountain bikes with them.

This year's W100K was the first time Team 43 alumni were invited back to join the ride on the final day. Fifteen warriors from past W100K rides joined the 2015 warriors and President Bush for the final 20 miles of the ride. It was the start of a unique tradition to help warriors to expand their networks and get to know fellow service members.

In Case You Didn't Know...

As a brief reminder for those who forgot, or for many who didn't know, here's what happened, quietly, on January 1, 2015:

- Medicare tax went from 1.45% to 2.35%
- Top income tax bracket went from 35% to 39.6%
- Top income payroll tax went from 37.4% to 52.2%
- Capital gains tax went from 15% to 28%
- Dividend tax went from 15% to 39.6%
- Estate tax went from 0% to 55%
- A 3.5% Real Estate transaction tax was added.

Remember these facts:

- These new taxes were all passed *solely with Democrat votes!*
- *Not a single Republican voted for these new taxes!*
- These new taxes were all passed in the *Affordable Care Act, aka Obamacare.*
