When finished they are "Branded or Laser Engraved "with the TOMBOY TOTE LOGO and then off they go to be sold in stores and on the internet."

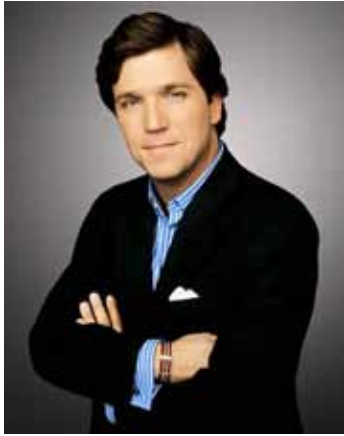

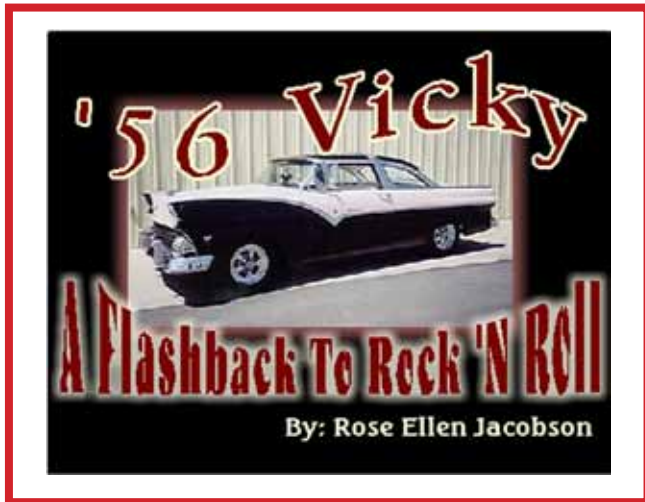

In Remembrance

Our longtime RWCL member *Sonia Flinn* lost her husband in December. Here is a memorial article to him.

A private memorial service was held for *Don Flinn* on Sunday December 12, 2010 at his home in Eugene, Oregon. He died on November 3, 2010 from the complications of a stroke he had suffered several months earlier.

Don Flinn was born *October 3, 1923* in Tulsa Oklahoma to *Grace and George Flinn*. He grew up in *Joplin, Missouri*, the eldest of three sons. Like his father, he went to medical school, and graduated from Harvard Medical School in 1946, at the age of 22.

The following year, he married the love of his life, *Sonia Opalinsky*. He enlisted in the Air Force and rose to the rank of Colonel. He joined N.A.S.A. and was involved in U.S. space exploration, from its inception. He helped select the Mercury and Gemini astronauts and was one of a team of six physicians who would examine them immediately before each flight then examine them again, on the recovery aircraft carrier, after they splashed down.

After leaving the Air Force in 1967, he turned to academia. He served as the Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry at Texas Tech, was the Assistant Dean of the U.C.L.A. Medical School, and retired from U.C.L.A. as Professor Emeritus in 1993.

He is survived by his wife of 64 years, Sonia, three adult children, Don Jr., Cindy, and Gary and two brothers, Rob and George.

Terri Moffett has generously accepted my invitation to be Vice President of RWCL. At our next general meeting we will be voting for both Terri as VP and Nina Rogers as our new Chaplain. For those of you that don't know Terri, here is a brief Bio.

Originally Terri, is from South Carolina, but she and her husband, Dale, have lived on a family homestead, west of Junction City, for nearly 49 of the 168 years it has been in the family.

They raised cattle, sheep, timber and 3 daughters on this ranch until 1979, when a herbicide used for vegetation management came under attack by women in Alsea Valley.

Terri managed the logging office and did all the things moms do with very active girls; brownie scouts, school sports, PNSA ski racing, 4-H livestock, entertaining, fund-raising, general contractor of the Junction City High School Track and Soccer field, all the usual stuff.

Terri's first trip to Washington, DC was with *Oregon Women in Timber* to lobby the Carter Administration on it's potential ban of the herbicide 2-4-5-T which was sprayed on the forest for vegetation management, but women in Alsea claimed was causing miscarriages. They lost!

This trip was followed by many others where Mom and her girls (two went on to work on the hill) would lobby on behalf of the industry with

Associated Oregon Loggers and Oregon Lands Coalition. On two trips, she served as the NW coordinator for a national effort that brought hundreds to DC with lots of publicity about the spotted owl. They lost again!

This background set the stage for getting involved with a young man from Pendleton's U.S. Senate race against Ron Wyden in 1996 for the seat being vacated by Senator Bob Packwood.

Gordon Smith lost that race (our first mail in ballot in January of 1997), but went on to run again in November of 1997 and won the Hatfield seat.

Senator Smith remains the only person who has ever run for the U.S. Senate twice in one year.

Smith opened 5 offices around the state and Terri became the *Western Oregon Field representative* located in Eugene. She served as the go-to person for the Senator to seven counties for twelve years. Terri continued to work on not only his campaigns, but also volunteered on the 2000 presidential election when *Dick Cheney* came to her home town of Junction City; she then served as the 2004 Regional Chair for the *Bush/Cheney campaign* when *Vice President Cheney* came to Eugene.

After *Senator Smith* was defeated by the "Obama Wave" Terri worked for *Allen Alley* for a year and then for Jim Huffman. She is delighted to have finally won an election (after 3 losses). Mr. Alley won the seat of Chairman of the *Oregon Republican Party*.

Somewhere about 25 years ago she became a *PCP of the Lane County Central Committee* and worked with other great republicans to reinvigorate the party after the 2000 election of President Bush. This was about the time she became a member of the
