Thank you all for coming and participating. Your Board is taking an active interest in all these ideas and we will keep you apprised of changes.

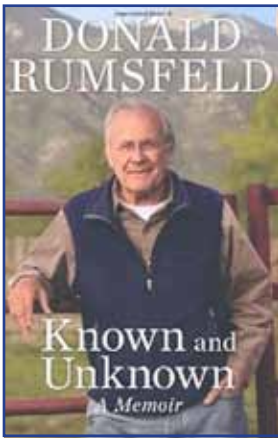
Want to Serve?

I really loved this book *“Known/Unknown: A Memoir”* by Donald Rumsfeld. He’s worked for everyone: In his early life he was a Navy aviator who continued in the navy reserve until he transferred to the Individual Ready Reserve when he became Secretary of Defense in 1975 and retired with the rank of captain in 1989. He worked for all these administration in one form or another, Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson and also Nixon and Ford administration.

He’s been the youngest Secretary of Defense after Vietnam and he served there too. He was appointed to special assignments for President Reagan and he returned to work at the pentagon for President Bush as Secretary of Defense at the age of 68.

Rumsfeld’s book makes you realize how much we know and how much we don’t know, hence the name of the book. Mr. Rumsfeld shares many stunning memories like where he was during 9/11 and what he did that day and his opinion of President George W. Bush.

I think you would enjoy this book and his personal musing so I highly recommend it.
