SALEM – Senator **Richard Devlin** (D-Tualatin) and Representative **Peter Buckley** (D-Ashland), co-chairs of the Legislature's Joint Ways and Means Committee, announced today that the committee will hold six public hearings across the state to consider comments on the state budget.

The hearings will begin in **Eugene** and will include stops in **Ashland, Bend, Hermiston, Portland, and Tillamook** as well as a hearing at the State Capitol. Several of the meetings will offer live streaming of the meetings, and the Hermiston meeting will offer video conferencing so participants in other eastern Oregon locations can participate remotely.

FAMILY LOSES 72 POUNDS AND SLASHES FOOD BUDGET IN HALF

Former RWCL President, Ina McElroy & Family Succeed!

Jackie, 40, and Kenny Reese, 48, of Windsor, Calif., have lost a significant amount of weight several times in the past, but like many dieters, they gained most of it back. In early December, Jackie described her family, which includes son Landon, 9, and her mother, Ina McElroy, 69, as a three-generation household of people who “all struggle with our weight. I would like to break this cycle so that my son does not follow in our footsteps.”

So the Reeses volunteered to participate in this year’s Family Fitness Challenge, an initiative to help families across the country get more active — and lose weight. The ongoing project is being produced in partnership with USA WEEKEND Magazine and the TV series The Doctors.

More than 400 families applied to take part in the challenge. Six families were chosen and each was paired with a fitness expert with the American College of Sports Medicine and a registered dietitian with the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.

Since the beginning of the year, the Reeses have been wearing Fitbit activity trackers and trying to walk at least 10,000 steps a day, which is the amount recommended by health experts. They’ve also started tracking their calories online and on their smart phones. They have cut way back on fast food and dining out and are cooking healthier meals at home.

Collectively, the four family members have lost 72 pounds over the past two months, and they slashed their food budget by more than half. Before they started the challenge, they were spending about \$500 a week on food including groceries, dining out and takeout, Jackie says. Now that they’re preparing most of their meals at home, they’re spending less than \$200 a week.
