

Delegates to the 38th biennial convention of the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) unanimously elected Missouri Republican leader Carrie Almond to head the organization for 2016-2017. The election was held Sept. 12 in Phoenix.

Almond currently serves as second vice president of the organization, and has held several other positions on the NFRW Executive Committee and Board of Directors. She also served as president of the Missouri Federation of Republican Women.

A resident of Chillicothe, Mo.,

Almond is an executive vice president of Citizens Bank & Trust, a Missouri-based community bank. She also manages the family farm of more than 2,000 acres.

"We are facing the most pivotal election of our lifetime, and I look forward to leading the NFRW through it," Almond said. "Our members volunteered more than 4.2 million campaign hours in the 2014 election cycle. We must have laser focus to take back the White House and keep our Senate and Congressional seats, just as we did in 2014." 🇺🇸
